College Process

- •What might be a good fit for one student, may not be a good fit for another student.
- •What college is best for your student?
 - A big school or a small school?
 - Community College
 - In state or out of state
 - Do you meet their admissions criteria?
 - Financial Fit
 - Do they offer your major/degree?
 - Lots to consider!

A good "fit" is a college where a student will be engaged – in class and out – by what the college has to offer.



College Process

Types of Schools

Safety/Likely

- Very Qualified
- Confident of Acceptance
- Willing to attend if admitted

Possible/Target

- Qualifications have been met
- Fairly certain of acceptance
- Willing to attend if admitted

Dream/Reach

- May be qualified/ highly competitive
- Low acceptance rate
- Would love to attend if admitted





Engagement is the key...

- TAKING A COURSE with a professor who makes learning exciting.
- WORKING WITH PROFESSORS who care about students personally.
- FINDING A MENTOR who encourages students to pursue personal goals.
- WORKING ON A PROJECT across several semesters.
- PARTICIPATING IN AN INTERNSHIP that applies classroom learning.
- BEING ACTIVE IN EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES.

A-G Requirements

- a. History/Social Science 2 years required
- b. English 4 years required
- c. Mathematics 3 years required, 4 years recommended
- d. Lab Science 2 years required, 3 years recommended
- e. Language Other Than English 2 years, 3 recommended
- f. Visual and Performing Arts 1 year required
- g. College Preparatory Electives 1 year required

A grade of C or better is required for each course to meet any A-G subject requirement.

Must have a 3.0 or above A-G courses Personal Insight Questions Comprehensive Review

Comprehensive Review

- Academic grade point average in all completed "a-g" courses, including additional points for completed UC-certified honors courses.
- Number of, content of and performance in academic courses beyond the minimum "a-g" requirements.
- Number of and performance in UC-approved honors and Advanced Placement courses.
- Identification by UC as being ranked in the top 9 percent of their high school class ("eligible in the local context," or ELC).
- Quality of a student's senior-year program, as measured by the type and number of academic courses in progress or planned.
- Quality of their academic performance relative to the educational opportunities available in their high school.
- Outstanding performance in one or more academic subject areas.



Comprehensive Review

- Outstanding work in one or more special projects in any academic field of study.
- Recent, marked improvement in academic performance, as demonstrated by academic
 GPA and the quality of coursework completed or in progress.
- Special talents, achievements and awards in a particular field, such as visual and
 performing arts, communication or athletic endeavors; special skills, such as
 demonstrated written and oral proficiency in other languages; special interests, such as
 intensive study and exploration of other cultures; experiences that demonstrate unusual
 promise for leadership, such as significant community service or significant participation
 in student government; or other significant experiences or achievements that
 demonstrate the student's promise for contributing to the intellectual vitality of a
 campus.
- Completion of special projects undertaken in the context of a student's high school curriculum or in conjunction with special school events, projects or programs.
- Academic accomplishments in light of a student's life experiences and special circumstances.
- Location of a student's secondary school and residence.

Personal Insight Questions

- 8 questions to choose from. Must respond to only 4 of the 8 questions.
- Each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words.
- All questions are equal. All are given equal consideration in the application review process
- There is no right or wrong way to answer these questions. It's about getting to know your personality, background, interests and achievements in your own unique voice.
- Use the additional comments field if there are issues you'd like to address that you didn't have the opportunity to discuss elsewhere on the application.

Personal Insight Questions

- 1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes or contributed to group efforts over time.
- 2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.
- 3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?
- 4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.
- 5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?
- 6. Think about an academic subject that inspires you. Describe how you have furthered this interest inside and/or outside of the classroom.
- 7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?
- 8. Beyond what has already been shared in your application, what do you believe makes you stand out as a strong candidate for admissions to the University of California?




Application Tips!

- Campuses use email to send critical, time-sensitive correspondence to applicants. Students should check their email regularly.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid is the gateway to financial aid

- Used to determine a family's Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
 - EFC is an objective means of measuring the strength of a family's resources and its ability to pay for college costs
- Must be completed every year of college
- Ways to complete the FAFSA
 - On the web desktop or laptop
 - On mobile devices smartphones or tablets
 - myStudentAid mobile app (download at your app store)
 - Paper version download a pdf version offthe web
