College Process

•What might be a good fit for one student, may not be a good fit for another student.

•What college is best for your student?

- A big school or a small school?
- Community College
- In state or out of state
- Do you meet their admissions criteria?
- Financial Fit
- Do they offer your major/degree?
- Lots to consider!

A good "fit" is a college where a student will be engaged – in class and out – by what the college has to offer.

College Process

Safety/Likely

- Very Qualified
- Confident of Acceptance
- Willing to attend if admitted

Possible/Target

- Qualifications have been met
- Fairly certain of acceptance
- Willing to attend if admitted

Dream/Reach

- May be qualified/ highly competitive
- Low acceptance rate
- Would love to attend if admitted

Target vs. Reach- With high number of applicants some target schools may be considered a "reach"



A-G Requirements

- a. History/Social Science 2 years required
- b. English 4 years required
- c. Mathematics 3 years required, 4 years recommended
- d. Lab Science 2 years required, 3 years recommended
- e. Language Other Than English 2 years, 3 recommended
- f. Visual and Performing Arts 1 year required
- g. College Preparatory Electives 1 year required

A grade of C or better is required for each course to meet any A-G subject requirement.

Requirements: Must have a 3.0 or above A-G courses Personal Insight Questions Comprehensive Review

NO transcripts or letters of recommendation accepted at time of application

Personal Insight Questions

- 8 questions to choose from. Must respond to only 4 of the 8 questions.
- Each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words.
- All questions are equal. All are given equal consideration in the application review process
- There is no right or wrong way to answer these questions. It's about getting to know your personality, background, interests and achievements in your own unique voice.

Personal Insight Questions

1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes or contributed to group efforts over time.

2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.

3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?

4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.

5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?

6. Think about an academic subject that inspires you. Describe how you have furthered this interest inside and/or outside of the classroom.

7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?

8. Beyond what has already been shared in your application, what do you believe makes you stand out as a strong candidate for admissions to the University of California?

What is UC looking for?



How long has the student been doing that activity? How much time has been committed to it?



Progression

Has the student worked on a particular skill or activity? Can they demonstrate growth over time?



Leadership

How has the student demonstrated leadership? What roles have they held?



Early Decision vs. Early Action

Early Decision

- 1st choice
 - Thorough college search completed
 - Visited
- Strong application
 - Even without 1st semester grades
 - Testing completed
- Need-based financial aid isn't primary concern
- Binding commitment
 - Must withdraw other applications, if admitted

Early Action

- Interested in early notification
- Strong application
 - Even without 1st semester grades*
 - Testing completed
- Can still apply to other colleges and learn admission decisions (and financial aid awards) before deciding where to accept admission

Junior Year Timeline

Junior Year

- Research campuses and majors.
 - Gather information about academics, financial aid, and campus life.
 - Develop a preliminary list of colleges that interest you.
- Sign up for newsletters, events or updates from colleges you're interested in
- Career assessment and explore pathways
- Take college tours/virtual tours
- Take SAT or ACT if needed
- *Advice from seniors* Start a google sheet with activities, awards, extracurriculars, etc.
- Seek out summer program opportunities: college course/s, summer programs for high school students, work, internships, community service, college tours/visits.

Summer after junior year

- Start working on Essays/PIQs,
- Work on college list
- Start collecting supplemental materials, if required
- *Advice from seniors* Start a google sheet with college list, deadlines, requirements for applications, etc.

Financial Aid Updates!

New CA Assembly Bill 469

- FAFSA or CADAA completion
- Requires schools to track and report filing status for all seniors
- Information sent home in senior letter
 - Opt-out form- Parents are able to indicate they will not file the FAFSA

There are significant changes happening to the FAFSA this year!

- Available to fill out in December, 2023 instead of October 1, 2023 (just for this year)
- Reduction of questions from 108 to 36
- Replacing EFC with Student Aid Index (SAI)
- Direct connect with IRS

Financial Aid

What is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid?



Collects student and parent(s) income, assets and household information EFC= SAI

- Calculates the Expected Family Contribution (EFC)
- Gateway to need-based student financial aid from:
 - Federal Government
 - State Government
 - Colleges & Universities

FINANCIAL AID OFFERS

- Applied to the school
 - + accepted to the school
 - + listed the school on your FAFSA
 - = You will get a Financial Aid Offer from the school

 Example: COA 		(Cost of Attendance)
-EFC Financial Need	- \$ 5,000 \$26,000	(Expected Family Contribution)

- Schools offer varying amounts of financial aid, some more generous than others
- Applying to multiple schools gives you more financial aid offers to consider



FSA ID Needed to File FAFSA

STUDENTS WILL COMPLETE IN SENIOR TRANSITION! The FSA ID is a digital signature used to sign the FAFSA, Direct Loan and Parent PLUS loan Master Promissory notes, and to access federal student aid sites.

- Student creates their own
- Parent creates their own
 - SSN and Date of Birth needed
- Common mistakes:
 - SSNs switched
 - Parent creates password for student
 - Student creates password for parent
- Can log in with a verified mobile phone number
