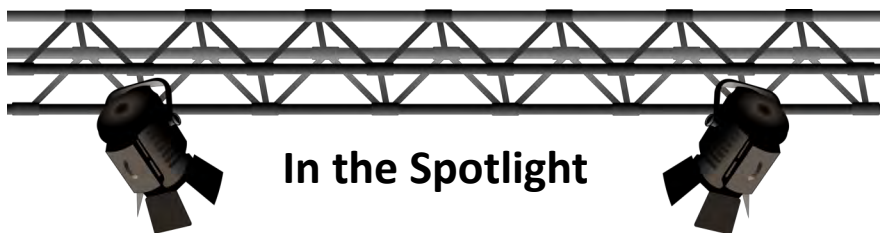

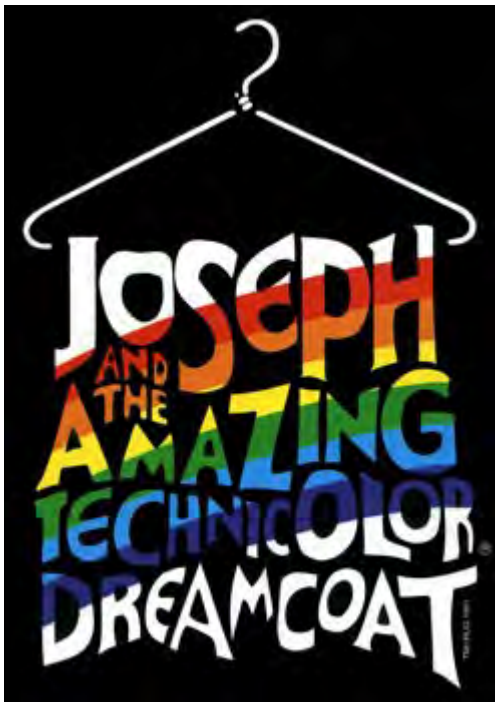

SUMMER FUN!



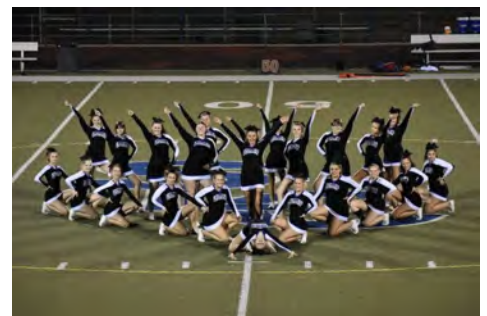

A Day in the Life of a U-Prep Science Student; as told by Science Teacher, Cory Poole

FRIDAY, 1:00PM: In the physical sciences (8th grade, CP Physics, AP Physics 1 and 2) we've been having our 11th annual paper tower building contest (maybe more...I've only been here for 11.) Students have 50 minutes to build the tallest freestanding tower they can out of 1 sheet of paper and 50 cm (20 inches) of tape. The kids have had lots of fun planning and building and many of the towers have been quite impressive. After 5 periods the record for the day so far is 157 cm (about 5'2"). The school record is over 2 meters tall (over 6'7") with 2 towers over that height! Below is a tower that was around 120 cm (around 4 feet) tall.

FRIDAY, 1:10PM: I forgot to include chemistry as a physical science! And for those wondering about the height I estimated for that tower being only 4 feet tall it's because in the picture they are probably higher than that but they weren't stable (have to stay up at least 10 seconds unsupported), I was stating their final stable height.

FRIDAY, 2:05PM: The likely champions created a tower in Chemistry class that ended up at 188 cm (6'2"). Built by Delaney D., Jordan B., and Celeste F. This is definitely in the top 5 towers in school history. The picture is probably before it reached full height, but pretty close.

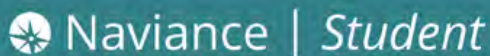

We were able to see Rome, Naples, Capri, Sorrento, Pompeii, Bari, Delphi, Mykonos, Samos, Patmos, Santorini, and Athens. In Rome, we saw sights such as the Colosseum and the Trevi Fountain, we took a bus tour around most of the city, and experienced the local cuisines! In Capri, we experienced the Marina Grande port and the amazing views of the waters, and cliffs from the top in the Augustus Gardens and even tried the famous of lemons of the island. We finished our excursion in Athens and the rich history of what it had to offer, such as the Acropolis and a traditional Greek evening, and had time to explore the Plaka where one can buy all the souvenirs they could carry.
