The Shasta County Mini Maker Faire occurred on September 15th 2018 at the Shasta District Fair Grounds in Anderson. At this biennial community event there were many vendors and makers who shared their passions of creating with participants of the faire. Families also create alters with photos and items that might have belonged to their loved one. The skull is a symbol in the culture demonstrating that everyone passes. The skull is often decorated with beautiful designs and sometimes embedded with humor in order to keep the celebration happy and without sorrow. Each student created a skull of clay and demonstrating their own interpretation of meaning of the Dia de Los Muertos.

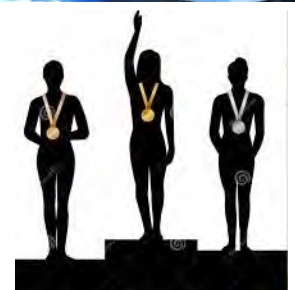

This month counselors are out in classrooms reviewing over the UC/CSU A-G Requirements with our students. The A-G / College Entrance Requirements are a sequence of high school courses that students must complete (with a grade of C or better) to be minimally eligible for admission to the University of California (UC) and California State University (CSU) systems. U-Prep's high school graduation requirements align with the minimum A-G requirements. See the guide below for more information!
