
MATHCOUNTS

2020-2021 REGISTRATION

Starting the week of February 3rd junior high counselor, Mr. Williams will meet with current 6th and 7th grade students during ASAP to hand out course registration packets, review course offerings and answer any questions that may arise. For future high school students, Mr. Maikranz will meet with current 8th grade students during science and Mrs. Mason, high school counselor, will meet with current 9th, 10th and 11th grade students during English. Students will be given course registration packets, review course offerings and complete a four year academic plan in aeries. Registration packets are due back by February 14, 2020.

Starting March 2nd Mr. Williams, Mr. Maikranz and Mrs. Mason will visit science and English classrooms to meet with students individually and discuss their course selections. SAT Subject Tests- These are tests in specific subject areas taken separately from the SAT to help determine college acceptance (please check the admissions website). Starting fall 2012, the UC System no longer requires two SAT Subject Tests as part of the admissions requirement; however, for competitive campuses and majors, it's recommended that students take at least two SAT Subject Tests in related subject areas. Most private colleges require at least two SAT Subject Tests.

ACT- The ACT website is where students register for the ACT. This website also provides helpful college exploration information. Important note: The ACT writing section is optional. It's strongly recommended that students take the optional writing section. If you choose to take the writing component, you must select the optional writing test when you register.
