

#### Featured Artist: Becca De Los Santos



Always having had a liking for boldness, Becca De Los Santos is honored to present a collection of acrylic works after a childhood of embracing and translating her affinity into art. She grew up "The Artist" of a nomadic military family and applied on her artistic tendencies to paper ever since she could accurately draw a pig in preschool. A drawer by nature, Becca has only practiced painting for the last four years, previously concentrated in ink and graphite illustrations. Having moved ten times in her seventeen years of life, she has observed the value of curiosity in culture's across the United States and abroad. Despite the multitude of sketchbooks she has crammed with sketches, she still seeks new opportunities to take on the stories of differences and contradictions between one group and the next, facts and fiction, past and present, etc. Where there is change, there is bound to be tales worthy of being told through color and light.

Most recently, Becca has come back from a year in France and is excited to apply her experience, full of questions, and exploration, on canvas. She will be graduating from University Preparatory School this May and attend Stanford University in the following fall.

Featured Artist: Talem Baek

Creativity has always been her title and anthem. With disregard for the norm, driven by sense perception and aesthetic, Talem Baek began as a young girl drawing snakes coming alive from foliage and girls without eyes. The other kids would ask why, the adults called her talented and the religious named her prophetic.

Currently creating a life that she loves, Talem is proud to present these pieces inspired from her peculiar dreams, colors, distinct sound, and feeling: sublime, surreal, and trippy. In this collection, she has rediscovered her roots, living and breathing into them and it's process: reveling in the serenity of the 2am solitude, prizing the music that she so loves and listens to when creating her work, being unconquered with the paint, in control of her own hands and it's movement.



#### Featured Artist: Jaden Ji



A skill that developed because her stick figure elephants were above average for a six year old, Jaden Ji is proud to present a set of works in acrylic featuring realism in an abstract form. Now seventeen years old, her elephants have evolved. From a background of graphite and ink drawing, she takes years of practice in realism and composition inspired by numerous artists on the internet to paint the two together into a message about the beauty in life, both literal and figurative. To appeal to literal beauty, there are flowers everywhere. However, there is also a motif of red spider lilies. Red spider lilies typically represent death; in combination with the opened eyes, it more symbolizes an end of innocence, as well as celebrating the ability to see beyond a cloud of ignorance. Golden chrysanthemums also appear, an icon of sorrow and mourning; decay and the loss of viridity are mourned, the lackluster chandeliers and tiles of the bathroom tarnished with wear. Yet it is all adorned with flowers to beautify what is a depressing scene. Mortality is celebrated, but life is what allows death to be. The eventual deterioration of things is what adds value to existence, and the effervescence of existence is what gives decay its meaning.



# TRAVEL ABROAD with SEPA





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


