










Cheer News!

Lions Club Speech Contest



Every year the Lions Club hosts a teen speech contest, giving students the opportunity to explore complex topics while vying for college scholarship money. Although originally cancelled, in late February it was announced the Lions Club speech contest was happening thanks to the improved COVID-19 numbers statewide. This year's prompt, appropriately, was: "Distance and Online Learning: Pros & Cons." Since the surprise announcement left only two weeks for students to write and rehearse their speeches, the five U-Prep contestants were the only students participating at the club level.

The students all took very different approaches to their speech. Rebecca Horrick (10), Olivia Crawford (11), Liana Funk (11), and Olivia Fong (11) all delivered speeches. **Rebecca Horrick's speech reflected on** the power of student connection best achieved in person, such as her experience with the swim team, while Olivia Crawford chose to base her **speech on Vygotsky's Zone of Proximal Development**, which she learned about in Ms. Kramer's AP Psychology class. The judges ultimately selected Karley Tioran (11), to advance to the next level, which folt appropriate since she was the contestant who had sport the most

felt appropriate since she was the contestant who had spent the most time as a distance learner. In her speech, Karley shared how fulfilling her life in Distance Learning was; for example, it had given her the freedom explore new hobbies like oil painting.



Each contestant received a \$25 check, and the winner received \$100, plus the opportunity to advance to the next level at the end of the month.



Junior, Karley Tioran, performed her speech at the Zone level on Saturday, March 27, uncontested. Despite some technical difficulties, she persevered and did not allow impediments to diminish her resolve. The judges were very impressed with her composure! Karley will compete at the region level in Weaverville against other competitors from the north state on April 16th. If she wins the regional competition, Karley will move on to the District competition.

On Monday, March 1st, U-Prep 8th grader students took the **PSAT™ 8/9**. The PSAT is a pressure-free way for students to begin exploring their path to college and a future career. The test assists students with:

1. Recognizing strengths. A personalized online PSAT 8/9 score report will include detailed information about your student's strengths and areas for growth. It assists students in leaning into areas where they excel and identify places where there is room for growth in order to be ready for college.

2. Exploring future careers. Students can explore college majors and careers that align with their personal interests with Roadmap to Careers, a unique online tool created by Roadtrip Nation and the College Board. The tool connects students to potential careers based on interest, showing where they can lead.

3. Choose high school courses. Knowing where students excel and what skills they may need to focus on can assist them in their choice of other 9th- and 10th- grade classes. In addition, students' score reports will suggest AP® courses that are beneficial. AP classes may provide your student an advantage in the admission process as well as allowing them to earn college credit while in high school, which could save time and money in college.
