Dear U-Prep Parents,

Many of our families heard about 'growth mindset' during Back-to-School Night. Research related to this topic and its implications continue to be an area of focus for professional learning among the U-Prep faculty. Carol Dweck, Ph.D., who coined the term 'growth mindset' is a leading researcher in the field of motivation; she is also a professor at Stanford University. Dr. Dweck's book entitled, "Mindset: The New Psychology of Success" explains why it's not just abilities and talents that foster success. Rather, a 'growth mindset' or 'fixed mindset' play a significant role in determining outcomes of potential. Dr. Dweck's research has compelling implications for classroom learning, parenting, and personal and professional success. Key ideas related to the growth mindset research include:

- Students tackle challenges because they understand that <u>learning takes a lot of</u> effort.
- Students don't give up when things get difficult; rather, they use strategies to persevere.
- Students are willing to take risks in their learning by participating in class. They
 understand that <u>mistakes are expected when they try hard things</u>.
 Mistakes are normal when working through challenging work.

We hope you will continue to enjoy learning about these and other exciting developments in the field of growth mindset contained within our latest edition of Panther Pride!


9th Grade Field Trip to Patrick's Point



FACTS ABOUT CHARTER SCHOOLS

Charter schools have more flexibility than conventional public schools in exchange for being held to additional standards to make sure they are meeting their student goals

Charter schools—which are **tuition-free public schools** created and operated by parents, organizations, or community groups to fill an educational need not otherwise offered by traditional schools—can direct their resources where their students need them most.

Charters have **more flexibility** than conventional public schools in exchange for being held to **additional standards** to make sure they are meeting their student goals. It is for those reasons that public charter schools are part of the solution to a better education system; they offer an alternative to the monopoly that is leaving so many students behind.

Studies show that **charter school students make greater academic progress** than students in traditional public schools. Sixty-four (64) percent of California's charter schools met student achievement targets on state tests in the 2008-09 school year compared to just 58% of non-charter schools.

Charter schools must admit all students who apply - if there is excess demand for the number of seats available, the school must conduct a lottery to determine who will be enrolled. As schools of choice, all startup charters must admit students regardless of the location of their residence.

Charter schools are required to hire **credentialed teachers**, just like traditional schools, for core subjects.

When lawmakers passed the Charter Schools Act of 1992, California became the second state in the country (after Minnesota) to enact charter school legislation. Since then, enrollment and performance have steadily grown, making charters in the state some of the strongest models in the nation.

In 2009, California charter schools grew by 20%, serving 56,000 new students. **Today, charters serve more than 341,000 students in California.** By 2017-18, or the 25th anniversary of the state's charter movement, we project that more than 1,000,000 students will attend California charter schools.

IMPORTANT REMINDER FROM THE ATTENDANCE OFFICE:

Students must have a "Permit to Leave" from the Attendance Office before leaving campus. If a student is ill, they are instructed to go to the health office where a call to a parent/guardian will be made. The Health Clerk will notify the attendance office and a permit will be issued. If a student has an appointment, the attendance office asks that the student either bring a note that morning or the parent/guardian place a phone call to the office at least one hour in advance of requested release time. Students may not leave campus without first obtaining a permit to leave. Leaving without a permit may result in a truancy.
