College Process

- •What might be a good fit for one student, may not be a good fit for another student.
- •What college is best for your student?
 - A big school or a small school?
 - Community College
 - In state or out of state
 - Do you meet their admissions criteria?
 - Financial Fit
 - Do they offer your major/degree?
 - Lots to consider!

A good "fit" is a college where a student will be engaged – in class and out – by what the college has to offer.



College Process

Safety

- Very Qualified
- Confident of Acceptance
- Willing to attend if admitted

Target

- Qualifications have been met
- Fairly certain of acceptance
- Willing to attend if admitted

Reach

- May be qualified/ highly competitive
- Low acceptance rate
- Would love to attend if admitted
- Target vs. Reach- With high number of applicants some target schools may be considered a "reach"

"Selective Majors" may play a part!





A-G Requirements

- a. History/Social Science 2 years required
- b. English 4 years required
- c. Mathematics 3 years required, 4 years recommended
- d. Lab Science 2 years required, 3 years recommended
- e. Language Other Than English 2 years, 3 recommended
- f. Visual and Performing Arts 1 year required
- g. College Preparatory Electives 1 year required

A grade of C or better is required for each course to meet any A-G subject requirement.


Personal information





What is your name?

We'd like to know your legal name - the name that appears on official documents, like your birth certificate, passport or driver's license - and your preferred name, if you have one. A preferred name is the name you wish to be known or identified by that is different than your legal name.







Personal Insight Questions

- 8 questions to choose from. Must respond to only 4 of the 8 questions.
- Each response is limited to a maximum of 350 words.
- All questions are equal. All are given equal consideration in the application review process
- There is no right or wrong way to answer these questions. It's about getting to know your personality, background, interests and achievements in your own unique voice.

Personal Insight Questions

- 1. Describe an example of your leadership experience in which you have positively influenced others, helped resolve disputes or contributed to group efforts over time.
- 2. Every person has a creative side, and it can be expressed in many ways: problem solving, original and innovative thinking, and artistically, to name a few. Describe how you express your creative side.
- 3. What would you say is your greatest talent or skill? How have you developed and demonstrated that talent over time?
- 4. Describe how you have taken advantage of a significant educational opportunity or worked to overcome an educational barrier you have faced.
- 5. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?
- 6. Think about an academic subject that inspires you. Describe how you have furthered this interest inside and/or outside of the classroom.
- 7. What have you done to make your school or your community a better place?
- 8. Beyond what has already been shared in your application, what do you believe makes you stand out as a strong candidate for admissions to the University of California?

What is UC looking for?



How long has the student been doing that activity? How much time has been committed to it?



Progression

Has the student worked on a particular skill or activity? Can they demonstrate growth over time?



Leadership

How has the student demonstrated leadership? What roles have they held?





Click the My Application tab to complete the rest of your application. You must complete all sections for a quadrant to show as complete. All quadrants must be complete to submit your application.




This shows your progress towards completing all the required information for this quadrant.



Application

- 1. Gather materials-The information you'll need to complete your applications
- 2. Create an account-Get started at any time
- 3. Add colleges-Start building your My Colleges list
- Engage supporters-Collaborate with counselors, teachers, and more
- 5. Understanding requirements-Keep track of each college's unique application requirements
- 6. Plan essays-Organize and plan for your writing prompts
- 7. Submit your application-Review and submit your application

Early Decision vs. Early Action


Early Decision

- o 1st choice
- Strong application
 - Even without 1st semester grades
 - Testing completed
- Binding commitment
 - Must withdraw other applications, if admitted

Early Action


- Interested in early notification
- Strong application
 - Even without 1st semester grades
 - Testing completed
- Can still apply to other colleges and learn admission decisions (and financial aid awards) before deciding where to accept admission



Support During College Application Process

- Discuss
 - Post-Secondary plans/options
 - college selection
 - number of applications
 - financial aid
- Encourage "thank-yous" for letters of recommendations & Scholarships
- Encourage student to use an appropriate email address
- Use transcript when completing applications
- Review applications before submission
- Support during acceptance/non-acceptance application process



Junior Year Timeline

- Explore post-secondary options
- Continue to take challenging classes and earn good grades.
- Get involved in school and your community! Colleges and scholarship programs look at extracurricular activities. What did you do in those activities? How did you contribute?
- Begin taking a more serious look at colleges and universities. Gather information about admissions, financial aid, and campus life. Begin to get a feel for college life.
- Visit as many potential university/college campuses as possible, talk with admissions counselors.
 - U-Prep College Trips
- If needed, register for the SAT or ACT in the spring.
- Seek out summer program opportunities: college course/s, summer programs for high school students, work, internships, community service, college tours/visits.
- *Advice from seniors* Start a google sheet listing information about what you have done in high school (awards, honors, recognitions, hobbies, activities, work experience).
- Explore your interests and possible careers. College & Career Options provides free career exploration and advising.

Summer after junior year

- Start working on Essays/PIQs,
- *Advice from seniors* Start a google sheet with college list, deadlines, requirements for applications, etc.

PSAT

WEDNESDAY, OCTOBER 16TH

- The 2026 Competition Begins in 2024
 - The 2024 Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT®) is the qualifying test for entry to the 2026 National Merit® Scholarship Program.
 - The competition will span about 18 months from entry in the fall of 2024 until the spring of 2026 when scholarships for college undergraduate study will be awarded.
 - It is expected that about 3.5 million students will take the PSAT/NMSQT in 2024, and approximately 1.3 million of them will meet requirements to enter this program.
 - Types of Scholarships
 - Some 7,140 National Merit Scholarships of three types and approximately 740 Special Scholarships will be awarded in 2026; these 7,880 awards will have a combined value of over \$35 million. Different types of scholarships will be offered, but no student can receive more than one monetary award from NMSC.

Financial Aid Updates!

New <u>CA Assembly Bill 469</u>

- FAFSA or CADAA completion
- Requires schools to track and report filing status for all seniors
- Information sent home in senior letter
 - Opt-out form- Parents are able to indicate they will not file the FAFSA

There have been significant changes happening to the FAFSA! Some of the biggest changes are listed below

- Available to fill out in December, 2024
- Reduction of questions from 108 to 36
- Replacing EFC with Student Aid Index (SAI)
- Direct connect with IRS



What is the Free Application for Federal Student Aid?

Collects

Student and parent income, tax, assets, and household information

Determines

Eligibility for needbased student financial aid from:

- Federal government
- State government
- Most colleges and universities

Calculates

Student Aid Index (SAI), a measure of the family's financial strength

- Gateway to need-based student financial aid from:
 - Federal Government
 - State Government
 - Colleges & Universities

FINANCIAL AID OFFERS

- Applied to the school
 - + accepted to the school
 - + listed the school on your FAFSA (can list up to 20)
 - = You will get a Financial Aid Offer from the school
- Example:

COA \$29,000 (School Cost of Attendance)

-SAI _ \$ 4,000 (Your Student Aid Index)

Financial Need \$25,000

- Schools offer varying amounts of financial aid, some more generous than others
- Applying to multiple schools gives you more financial aid offers to consider

Which of a Dependent Student's Parents Need an FSA ID?

If parents are married If parents are unmarried + living together If parents are divorced/separated + NOT living together

+ File taxes together

_

only one parent needs an account Both parents need accounts The parent who provided more financial support in the last 12 months needs an account

OR

+ DIDN'T file taxes together

=

both parents need accounts



OR

If that parent remarried + <u>DIDN'T</u> file taxes together

=

both the parent and stepparent need accounts
