RED RIBBON DAY

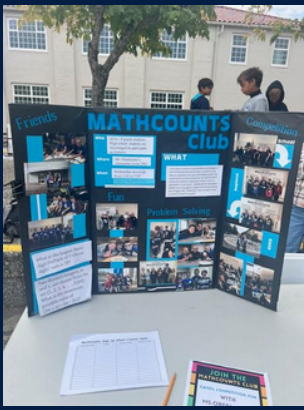


Classes showed off their creativity by decorating their doors for our Red Ribbon Week contest. Mrs. Kramer's class won the contest with their Frankenstein inspired door!

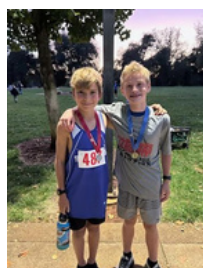


Junior High CROSS COUNTRY

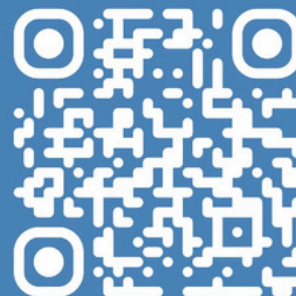
