












Junior High Cheer

In addition, Asher was voted most outstanding upper weight wrestler of the tournament. All of the novice wrestlers started the season at the Corning Kickoff and they were lucky enough to have 3 individual champions, Cici Edwardson, Allison Hanagan and Ariana Woodbury.
